



Learn to Save a Life & Get Started in a Rewarding Career

As an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), you are a member of the pre-hospital medical team providing immediate life-saving care at the scene of accidents, in medical emergencies, and during the patient transport to the hospital. The basic task of the EMT is to stabilize serious injuries and sustain the life of the patient until further care can be given in a hospital emergency department.

Your Choice: 12 Weeks, 7 Weeks, or Hybrid

For EMT training at Northeastern University, you now have several choices: a 12-week basic program comprised of eight hours of class per week for 12 weeks (two classes per week), plus 5 all-day Saturday exercises (indoor and outdoor) that include practical demonstrations of ambulance operation, vehicle extrication and other emergency care skills; an intensive format of the program is also available enabling you to complete the program in 7 weeks by studying 18 hours a week (3 all-day classes per week); or you can take the course partially on-line in our new hybrid sections.

Hands-on Training from Boston-area Medical Professionals

When you face a life threatening emergency, you want to be confident in your skills and training. Because Northeastern's Institute for Emergency Medical Services is a high-quality, comprehensive University-based program, you'll get hands-on training from specialists who are practitioners in the field. You'll gain the knowledge and skills that are necessary to achieve success as a practicing EMT.

Upon successful completion of the course, you will receive:

- Nine quarter hour credits from the School of Professional and Continuing Studies, the part-time division of Northeastern
- CPR Healthcare Provider Card from the American Heart Association
- 1.5 CEUs by the National Athletic Trainer's Association Board of Certification

This course is based on the U.S D.O.T Revised EMT/Basic National Standard Curriculum and is approved by the Massachusetts Office of Emergency Medical Services.

Admission Requirements

Although there is no prerequisite to participate in the EMT-Program, students must be at least 18 years of age to take the state certification examination.

Accreditation

Tuition

Tuition for the course is **\$1,287**. Once you have enrolled, you will receive a bill at your home address.
